Paper Pencils, pens, and markers Pictures of cultural masks from different countries Access to the internet for research purposes (optional) Introduction(10 minutes): Introduce the theme of Culture Day and explain the significance of cultural masks in various cultures around the world. Show pictures of cultural masks from different countries and ask students to identify the countries they belong to. Explain that the objective of the lesson is to create a mind map on the theme of Culture Day and Cultural Masks, using a variety of visual and written elements. Activity (40 minutes): Distribute paper and pencils to the students. Ask the students to write the words "Culture Day" in the centre of the paper and draw a circle around it. Encourage the students to brainstorm and write down any ideas that come to their minds when they think of Culture Day and Cultural Masks, such as the different types of masks, the history behind them, the significance of masks in various cultures, etc. Encourage the students to add visual elements to their mind maps by drawing pictures of cultural masks from different countries, as well as any other relevant images. Encourage the students to use different colours and textures to make their mind maps visually appealing. Closure (10 minutes):

Ask the students to share their mind maps with the class. Encourage the students to discuss the similarities and differences between their mind maps and how they approached the task. Recap the key points covered in the lesson, emphasising the importance of understanding and appreciating cultural diversity. Assessment:	
The mind maps created by the students can be used to assess their understanding of the theme and their ability to organise and communicate ideas visually and verbally. The teacher can also provide feedback on the use of colours, textures, and other visual elements to make the mind maps visually appealing and engaging.

Procedures:		
Introduction (5 minutes):
